

# **Looking Back at 2014**

### RESPONSIBILITY IN MATAGALPA, NICARAGUA

The 2014 school year had an enrollment of 670 students: 100 were in the Robert Keenan Kindergarten and 570 attended the Oasis de Esperanza Primary School which has three sessions a day.


Kindergarten classes are for the four and five year olds. Our primary school classes are for six to eighteen year olds with our emphasis placed on the working student who didn't start school until s/he was older. Most of our students must continue to work to help support their families.

**Kindergarten School**: Our main emphasis at Responsibility is education for the children living in the dirt-floored shacks around the old Tijuana municipal dump. That is where we operate a preschool/kindergarten for approximately 67 students.





**Summer School/ Camp:** This summer you sent 75 children from the old Tijuana garbage dump to camp. Our kids had classes in art, computers, English and sports. Afternoons were spent at museums, parks, and the kids' favorite place, the beach.







### COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIPS FOR FORMER STUDENTS

This past year we gave full tuition scholarships to five former students to attend college.

#### CHRISTMAS IN MEXICO

We played Santa to 425 children including the Special Education School Students. Bikes were the favorite at our school. The nonprofit organization, The World of Children, played
